Arthur Hamilton, C. M., president of St. Joseph's College, Princeton, N. J. He spoke at commencement exercises for the 8t. John's group.

Communism is still an evil in principle and practice."

Father Hamilton also attacked "quacks and charlatans" among educators who, he said, sowed the feducators who, he said, sowed the seed of which "Stalin and Hiler are merely reaping the harvest."

"In brief," he added, "too many over-desreed educators have meither the mind nor the heart nor the soul of an educator."
