### Rites Tomorrow For Lt. John Duffy

Lt. John F. Duffy, who was killed in a plane crash in England on May 5, 1945, after completing 31 missions over Germany as navigator with the 8th Air Force, will be buried with military honors tomorrow in Holy Cross Cemetery. A solemn requiem mass will be offered at 10 a.m. in Our Lady of Angels R. C. Church. Until shortly before the mass the body will be in the home of his mother, Mrs. Jane Woods Duffy, at 364 72d St., where memorial rites will be held at 8 o'clock tonight by the American Legion.

Lieutenant Duffy, who was 22 at the time of his death, held the Air Medal with four oak leaf clusters, and the Presidential citation. His father, Edward Duffy, died some time ago.

Born in Brooklyn, Lieutenant Duffy was graduated from the parish school of Our Lady of Angels and St. Michael's High School. He had been employed by the American Gas and Electric Company of Manhattan. He was a student at St. John's University when he enlisted in November, 1942. He was an only child.
